Loud voices and shouting, loud noises.


Language of violence, sexual references and innuendo, and misogyny. We have made intentional edits to remove the racist language from the original script.

In this story romantic love leads to a double suicide. It is performed by the actors using a foam sword to depict the act and stylized in a purposeful way intended to provoke mirth in the onstage audience.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I am at home when I am in an empty theatre; it's where stories come alive and imagination takes flight. It's the place where anything is possible with a little bit of magic and hard work.

So, when we selected A Midsummer Night's Dream for a touring production, its magical world felt like the perfect fit. We wanted to captivate audiences at local junior and high schools, while also creating a work that could evolve into a main stage production. The challenge: make a piece adaptable for any setting—a cafeteria, a proscenium, or a thrust stage—and ensure the heart of the story remained intact.

Drawing inspiration from abandoned theaters—spaces with just a ghost light or a few forgotten props—we built a production where the mechanicals, who put on their own play within the play, lead us into the magical world. Fitting since they embody the spirit of putting on theater with whatever is available.

After taking the tour across the Wasatch Front, the show has now transitioned to Studio 115. We deepened the acting work, added lights, sound, and additional costumes that weren't possible on tour, allowing us to embrace the full theatrical experience and tailor it to a new space and new audiences.

This production also explores new possibilities with gender-swapped casting, without changing pronouns, embracing Shakespeare's original fluidity in performance. It's a reminder of how theater can break the rules and reflect the world around us.

Working with our assistant director, Emily Tatum, has been a highlight of the process. Her choreography and staging have brought fresh energy to the production, and I'm excited to see where her career takes her next.

We hope this production entertains, inspires, and lets you see Shakespeare's timeless story in a new way.

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
