DRAMATURGICAL NOTE

By the time Richard Brinsley Sheridan (1751-1816) wrote *The School for Scandal* in 1777, he had himself been at the center of a number of scandals. In 1772, at the age of 21, Sheridan ran off to France with a young singer, Elizabeth Ann Linley, to help her escape the unwanted advances of an older, married man. This, no doubt, caused an uproar. Upon their return to Bath, Richard fought two duels with the man in question and was gravely injured. One newspaper even reported—obviously incorrectly—that Sheridan had died of his wounds, an event he drew upon for comic effect in *The School for Scandal*.

Although his father, a former theatre manager and actor, opposed the match, Richard and Elizabeth were finally married in 1773 and they moved to London. Elizabeth had an established career as a singer, but Richard believed that allowing her to continue to perform would harm his standing as “a gentleman.” So it was of necessity that he turned to theatre as a source of income.

English print culture exploded in the 18th century, and the citizens of Great Britain enjoyed the greatest freedom of expression among the large European powers during the early decades of that century. A number of British writers took full advantage of this freedom penning merciless satires of politicians, royals, and social elites. But in 1737, Parliament passed the Licensing Act, which established government censorship of theatre, limited the production of plays to two London stages, defined actors performing outside of these theatres as “vagabonds,” and imposed fines and even hard labor on those caught violating the law. Virtually overnight, political satire on the English stage was silenced and the sentimental comedy prevailed until Oliver Goldsmith and then Richard Brinsley Sheridan revived the comedy of manners with *She Stoops to Conquer* (1773) and *The Rivals* (1775), respectively.

But Sheridan had his eye on commercial success, not dramatic innovation. His comedies employ tried and true techniques that date back to ancient Rome, including stock characters, mistaken identity, disguises, and overheard conversations. *The School for Scandal* (1777) utilizes all these devices to attack hypocrisy and gossip-mongering. Given his experiences as a young man in Bath, Sheridan’s interest in these themes should come as no surprise. The play interrogates the

18th century belief in sentiment (sincere emotion) as a force for good through the aptly named Surface brothers. Joseph Surface poses as “man of sentiment,” but this is a façade he has cultivated to get what he wants. When given the opportunity to put his money where his mouth is, Joseph demurs and is punished for his selfishness and hypocrisy. Likewise, the gossip-monger-in-chief, Lady Sneerwell, is unmasked and humiliated when one of her minions turns on her and reveals her secrets. The profligate Charlese Surface, on the other hand, redeems himself by acting according to his sincere emotions without trumpeting it to the world.

As this is a comedy of manners, Sheridan ensures that the audience maintains a position of superiority to the characters. They announce their motivations and secret desires. They explain all of their schemes (except for one, which I will not reveal here). Part of the fun is in knowing more than the characters do and watching as they step on proverbial rakes. But another part of the fun is recognizing ourselves in a play that was written almost 250 years ago. The technology we use may have changed, but what we do with it hasn’t changed all that much. 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
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
